Holloways Celebrate Five Generations at LHS

In 1904, Lena McCabe was one of twelve students to graduate in the 12th graduating class at Lompoc High. Lena married James W. Lena's granddaughter Barbara moved from Lompoc when she was ten.

Cheyenne is the daughter of Shaleen Holloway, and is therefore the fifth generation Holloway family member to have attended Lompoc High.

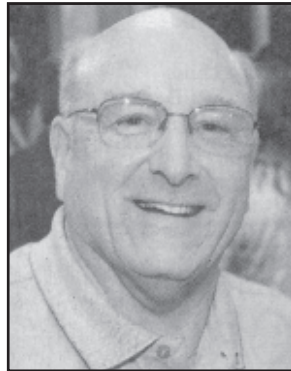
